Our goal is to improve children and young people's health, wellbeing and quality of life, through play.

Hackney Play Association's (HPA) aim is to make Hackney a great place for play – particularly for children facing barriers due to poverty, disability, gender and race.

We provide:

- FREE (open access) after school, holiday and youth clubs for children and young people at Homerton Grove Adventure Playground and Pearson Street Adventure Playground
- Training and qualification courses in playwork and related skills for staff, volunteers, trustees and young people
- Information and advice on all aspects of play provision
- Advocacy for quality play and play provision
- Regular support for all play providers in Hackney
- Support for disabled children and their families to participate in play provision.

MESSAGE FROM KAY OUR HPA DIRECTOR

It has been a good year, but funding continues to be an issue, as support becomes harder to secure. We are looking at a range of sponsorship options and innovative ways to generate income. I would like to thank our sponsor Arch Insurance for their continued support in this challenging time.

Our services to children and their families in Hackney continues to be our priority, running after schools clubs and holidays playschemes, alongside mental health themed youth sessions, and HAF projects: where we provide hot healthy meals to around 70 children per day.

One of our mental health themed youth sessions included a weekly Good for Boys session, where young men get the chance to express themselves and get support for their mental health through discussion, activities and trips out.

We led a children's play march to parliament as part of International Day of Play on 11th June, highlighting the importance of play in childhood and made a noise for more funding to be made available and play to be recognised as a right for all children (Article 31 United Nations Convention of the Rights of the child)

We look forward to another exciting year, where we have plans to develop the sites, with the help of our corporate volunteers, develop our staff, through training and development opportunities and extend our offer to new schools and other community partners

SPOTLIGHT ON YOUNG PERSON PROJECT -MENTAL HEALTH THEMED YOUTH SESSIONS

HPA were funded by Hackney Council (Children and Young Person Community Grant) to deliver mental health themed sessions for young people at Homerton Grove (Too Blessed to be Stressed) and Pearson Street (Good for Boys)



120 hours of mental

'I am 11 years old and I am here to tell you why youth has helped me and my friends! Youth is a place where me and other children feel welcomed it helps me feel more confident to help others and speak up for myself. We get to cook the food and then sit down and talk about our day and I like to ask everyone about their day and how they feel and talk about our problems and worries and this has inspired many children to be confident and happier to talk about problems. Children come here with big smiles on their face and I am one of them' - Homerton Grove young person comment.

'I feel the check in sessions are very good is very good for our mental health, to socialise with people and talk to other people about their day. I think the boys groups is good place to make friends, talk to other people and better your social skills' - Pearson Street young person comment.

SCHOOLS OUT







Schools Out, a time when children have the chance to play, explore, try new things, learn new skills, laugh, smile, have fun, get active, meet their friends or make new friends, take risks and feel safe.

Pearson Street and Homerton Grove Adventure Playgrounds hosted 10 weeks of playscheme ran over the Easter and summer holidays and after school during 2024.

Our schools out offer was enhanced during the Easter and summer of 2024 as we once again secured Holiday Activities and Food Funding (HAF), from Hackney Council, which ensured we could offer daily meals, more enriching activities, trips out and promote healthier eating awareness.

The range of fun enriching activities, that children and young people got the chance to experience, included dance, circus skills, non-contact boxing sessions, healthy eating club, arts and crafts, gardening and more.

Children from Homerton Grove also got to enjoy a panto at the Hackney Empire in the winter of 2024, oh yes they did!

OUR TRAINING OFFER







Our training programme, alongside playwork training, has covered topics such as:-

- Public speaking for playworkers
- Using power tools safely
- Incels , misogyny and the manosphere
- Cooking on a budget for playworkers
- Conflict management/ behaviour that challenges
- Paediatric First Aid
- Safeguarding level two.
- PlayWay an introduction to Playwork

After requests from other local authorities, Tower Hamlets, Lambeth, Kensington & Chelsea and Southwark, we have offered our training courses, tailored to their specific needs in their local play-settings. This is an example of our income generation. We continue to offer the course to playworkers and youthworkers in Hackney to support local quality play settings, with play qualified staff.

'To meet new friends and have fun getting involved in a big lot of things I wont do at home"


"We sometimes play a game called Uno, I'm good at it actually"
